Fontenelle Park Lagoon Nature Walking Tour Fact Sheet

CSO Clean Solutions for Omaha

Several species of native grasses and wetland plants are planted along the shoreline of the lagoon, which help to stabilize the shoreline from erosion and filter stormwater for improving the lagoon's water quality.

Establishing native vegetation takes longer than turf grass, as the plants first set their root systems deep into the ground before filling in to show their true potential. Now in its second full growing season, the native vegetation surrounding the lagoon will continue to grow fuller and thicker over time — aiding in both visual and environmental quality.

The improved lagoon is deeper than before and stocked with fish to offer another recreational opportunity for the community. Anglers will enjoy two new concrete platforms to cast from, including one ADA accessible landing and four natural stone landings.



Fontenelle Park Lagoon landscape improvements included:

- 1.5 acres of native grass and seeded vegetation surrounding the lagoon
- 12,540 native plug plantings around the shoreline
- 159 new trees planted within the park
- 3770-foot (0.7 mile) trail around the lagoon
